

COVID-19 VACCINE INFORMATION

If you live in Peoria, Tazewell and Woodford Counties

Eligibility Open to Everyone Age 16+

Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford County Health Departments have opted to expand eligibility on April 5. The State of Illinois as a whole will open up to all residents 16+ on April 12.

Residents age 16 and 17 should take note that Pfizer is the only vaccine approved for these ages.

Please check with your scheduling site to ensure it has the appropriate vaccine.

OSF HealthCare and UnityPoint Health hospital systems will be reaching out directly to their 16 and 17-year-old patients.
